Performance Programme.

- Beginners:** For dogs that are not eligible for Novice, Senior and Champion levels in the Performance Programme.
- Novice:** For dogs that have gained a minimum of 24 points in the Beginners classes, where 12 of those points must be obtained in agility classes.
- Senior:** For dogs that have gained a minimum of 36 points in the Novice classes, where 12 of those points must be obtained in agility classes, 6 from games classes and 6 from jumping classes, OR 48 points where 24 have been gained in agility classes.
- Champion:** For dogs that have gained a minimum of 48 points in the Senior classes, where 12 of those points must be obtained from agility classes, 12 points from jumping classes and 12 points from games classes, OR 60 points where 30 have been gained in agility classes.

Steeplechase Programme

- SC Beginners:** For dogs that are not eligible for SC Novice, SC Senior and SC Champion levels in the Steeplechase Programme.
- SC Novice:** For dogs that have gained a total of 24 points in the SC Beginners classes.
- SC Senior:** For dogs that have gained a total of 36 points in the SC Novice classes.
- SC Champion:** For dogs that have gained a total of 48 points in the SC Senior classes.

Special Classes

- Nursery:** Open to any dog 16 months of age and older that is not entered in any class in the performance programme for that day.
- Casual:** Open to any dog that is not entered in any other class but casual for that day.

At the Team England Tryouts, the winner of the overall Pentathlon and Games classes will be invited to represent Team England at the World Agility Open in the Individual **Pentathlon** or **Games**. You do not have to be a UKA member to enter.

- The Biathlon spot will be taken from the UKA Masters results.
- The Pentathlon spot will be taken from the results of the Pentathlon runs at the Agility 4 England Try Out in September.
- The Games spots will be taken from the results of the Games runs at the Agility 4 England Try Out in September.
- The "Super Win On Spot" is attainable at the CSJ Agility Open. This offers a place in all 3 individual events

All handler & dog partnerships wishing to be considered for selection for Team England 2020 must attend the September show and enter the England Try Out. If the win on spots from the CSJ Open or the UKA Masters Biathlon win on spot do not enter the England Try out, they will not be considered for additional events including Team. However they will retain their win on spots for those particular events.

You DO NOT have to be a UK Agility Member or Registered with the KC to Try Out

Team England's mission is to select a squad of handlers and dogs who will be competitive against the rest of the world, in all disciplines on offer at the WAO.

Team England strives to build for the future of English agility, by providing a forum to build on potential human/canine partnerships for future WAO World Championships.

The Team England Try Out ring will be 35m x 40m @ the Try Out Weekend.

Win on places

All dogs who succeed with a win-on placement must obtain an official WAO measurement to be eligible to compete. This can be obtained at the Agility 4 England show. If the place is declined or the winner is ineligible, the next dog/handler pairing will be invited. In the unlikely event that neither of the top two dogs are eligible, the selection committee will revert to a selection process to fill that spot on the team.

The "Super Win On Spot" – A place in all 3 individual events – via the CSJ Agility Open

Achieve the "Super Win On Spot" and you will be offered a place in **ALL 3 individual events - Biathlon, Pentathlon and Games.**

Earn points by placing in the top 8 in the overall Biathlon, Pentathlon, Games and CSJ National Championship as outlined below.

Individual classes in each event do not score points. Points are calculated separately for each height. The dog with the highest points in each height will gain the "Win On Spot" place for their country as long as the dog has placed in the top 8 of at least 3 events.

Points will be awarded in the following way:

Place Points

1st	45	5th	15
2nd	36	6th	10
3rd	28	7th	6
4th	21	8th	3

If a dog is eliminated in the CSJ National Championship Final no points will be scored for this class. In the event of a tie, the results from the Biathlon Agility result will decide the winner.

Important Note: If the winning handler does not want to take the Win On Spot or is ineligible due to height or nationality, the win on place will **not** transfer to the second placed handler.

Biathlon Win on Spot – Via UKA Masters Series

The highest placed eligible dog from the UKA Masters series will be invited to represent Team England at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Biathlon**. To ensure a level of consistency, but not to create a system where the person who attends the most events qualifies, points will be calculated from **ONLY** their best *three* Masters Heats Results and their results from the Masters final. Points will be awarded in the following way;

At each Masters Qualifier

- 1st in jumping or agility = 1 point
- 1st overall = 4 points
- 2nd overall = 3 points

- 3rd overall = 2 points
- 4th overall = 1 point

E.g. If a dog wins both the agility and jumping section and is therefore the overall winner, they will gain 6 points.

At the Masters final

- 1st in jumping or agility = 2 points
- 1st Overall = 8 points
- 2nd overall = 6 points
- 3rd overall = 4 points
- 4th overall = 2 points

The *maximum* points a dog can achieve is 30 points.

If an elimination occurs in either round overall points will not be awarded.

In the case of a tie on points, the result from the Masters final will take precedence. Masters results will be collated by UKA and will be published throughout the year. The winning handlers will be informed after the Masters Final during the UK Agility Grand Finals weekend.

The highest placed English handler/dog in the Pentathlon in each jump height will be invited to represent Team England at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Pentathlon**. The highest place Welsh handler/dog in the

Pentathlon in each jump height will be invited to represent Team Wales at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Pentathlon**.

Games Win on Spot – via Agility 4 England Show.

On September 6th - 8th @ Lydiard House, Lydiard Park, Lydiard Tregoze, Swindon, Wilts, SN5 3NY.

The highest placed English handler/dog in the combined Results in the Snooker and Gamblers at the Try Out in each jump height will be invited to represent Team England at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Games** event. However, to gain this invitation the winning dog must have gained a minimum of 45 points in the Snooker and achieved one of the gambles in the Gamblers class. If the winning dog does not meet the criteria the invitation **will not** be passed to second place. The highest placed Welsh handler/dog in the combined Results in the Snooker and Gamblers at the Try Out in each jump height will be invited to represent Team Wales at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Games** event. However, to gain this invitation the winning dog must have gained a minimum of 45 points in the Snooker and achieved one of the gambles in the Gamblers class. If the winning dog does not meet the criteria the invitation **will not** be passed to second place

To simulate the WAO event, the following runs will be used to decide the outcome of the Pentathlon win on spot; **Friday** Jumping & Agility, **Saturday** Jumping, **Sunday** Agility and WAO speedstakes.

The classes will follow WAO rules and will be scored using WAO individual Pentathlon scoring. WAO jump heights will be used.

The Speedstakes class will run in reverse order of the current standings after 4 rounds.

All dog and handler partnerships will also run in Snooker (Friday) and Gamblers (Saturday). The combined result will be used for a win on spot into the Games class (please note criteria above) and the performance of all competitors will be assessed to show their understanding of the Games classes to assist the Team managers when deciding other places on the Team.

Depending on size of entry, it is hoped that all of these classes will run in one ring, allowing the managers to assess performance in the consideration of other places.

All Show profits will be used by the 2020 England Team

Please read ALL the information below carefully:

Eligibility to enter the Try Out:

- Dog: KC Grades 6 & 7 or UKA Champion status on 1st September 2019. (Handlers may enter the event with the intention of reaching the required level/grade by 1st September. If they do not achieve this they will be unable to run and will forfeit their entry fee).
- You DO NOT need to be a UKA Member. Those handlers and dogs who are not registered with UKA can still enter. As part of entry they will need to register themselves and their dog with UKA and pay for this. They then need to notify UKA within five working days of the event that they wish to cancel their membership. A refund will then be given. They may only enter the Try Out event at the show
- Dogs must be eligible to travel outside of the UK under the rules of the Pet Travel Scheme. Further information can be found on the DEFRA web site (<http://www.defra.gov.uk/wildlife-pets/pets/travel/pets/>)
- All squad members must prove their own and dogs' eligibility to travel by the March squad training session (Sunday 22nd March 2020).

It is each handler's responsibility to ensure their dog's Pet Passport is valid to allow entry back into the UK on 18th May 2020

- Handler: To be born in England or a permanent resident of England, at the time of Agility 4 England Show.
- A valid passport/documentation will be required and shown by the March squad training session (Sunday 22nd March 2020)
- It is preferred that the handler/dog combination competing at the selection day is the regular partnership during the preceding agility season so other results can be assessed when considering classes.

All squad members, by entering the selection day and being selected, agree to the following Team England participation requirements:

- All squad members will support any fundraising/sponsorship requirements for Team England.
- All squad members will participate in any team activities with integrity, honesty and good sportsmanship.
- All squad members must participate in at least 3 of the 4 training sessions to be held in 2020 one of which must be the first session held in December. All squad members are encouraged to attend all training sessions. They **must** also attend the GT May 2020 show on the Sunday
- All team members will put their dog's needs ahead of their personal aspirations.
- All members will support, encourage & respect fellow team members and management before and during the WAO competition.

Competing Team & Reserve selection

In brief, the team will be decided using the following methods.

- Win on place via CSJ Agility Open (WAO Biathlon, Pentathlon & Games Class entry)
- Win on place via UKA Masters Series (WAO Biathlon Class entry)
- Win on place via the Pentathlon competition at Agility 4 England Show (WAO Pentathlon Class entry)
- WAO England 2019 medallists will be invited back to the team for a minimum of their automatic spot.

Remaining class spots will be offered to the partnerships who have achieved the win on places, providing the team management believe they will be competitive in these events. The Team Management may look to select additional dogs to fill these spots.

Team Management will then take into consideration the following:

- Performance at the Agility4England Try Out Event.
- Performance at CSJ Agility Open
- Performance in UKA Masters heats and Final
- Previous International performance. (WAO, EO & FCI Worlds)
- KC. Olympia, Crufts Senior and Championship Certificates
- UKA. CSJ Grand Prix, UKA Nationals, Games Challenge
- Team sportsmanship and ability to perform with a team.

Only dog and handler ENTERING & ATTENDING the Agility 4 England Try out will be considered for Team Selection. In the event of a Handler or Dog not being able to attend, only veterinary or extreme personal reasons will be considered in allowing Handler or Dog to still be in contention for selection. This is purely at the discretion of Team Management.

The team and reserves will be announced no later than 15th December 2019

WAO 2019 Medallists

WAO are inviting all individual podium winners to compete in the 2020 championships in the class in which their medal was won. Team England will be inviting all England 2019 individual medal podium winners to a place on the team. These handlers will compete under the Team England flag in the individual class in which the medal was won. To be considered for any other events they must follow the rules above.

Jump Height/Dog Height

There are four qualifying height divisions. Dogs may compete in a division larger than the actual dogs' height, but cannot compete in a lower division. Example: A dog which measures 450mm may enter & compete in the 600 division but cannot compete in the 400 division.

An official measurement will be taken on the day for all dogs applying for the 500 classes and lower, unless an official WAO measurement has already been taken for that dog.

You must compete in all relevant WAO win on spot events, in the correct WAO height category

When entering the Agility 4 England show choose Toy for 300, Midi for 400, Std for 500, Maxi for 600.

What Happens Next?

Current Masters standings will be posted on the England FB page throughout the year. Final heat positions will be posted at Agility 4 England. If you believe these to be wrong at that point you must notify the Team Management by 1st October. Failure to do so will mean the results will not be altered.

WAO Team England FB page will be updated with information concerning Try Outs and the WAO event. It is your responsibility to check this regularly in case of any changes to the above and to be informed of important information as it is released.

At the show, we will be requiring those that are trying out to help in the running of the event. This event in 2018 earned £4291.29 for the 2019 team. So that you can focus on the Tryout during the day, we will ask you to choose to help with the set-up of the show on Thursday or the pack down of the show on Sunday. If you apply on Plaza please tick the helpers form to say that you will help on Sunday. If you do not tick Sunday we will assume you are volunteering for Thursday. We will then assign you to a set up or a pack down job. We will also ask you to help at the end of each day to set up the rings and prepare the venue for the next day's competition. If you are unable to help for any reason it will not affect your chance of selection. However, any excess funds raised that go to the team from this event, will only be divided between handlers that actually helped.

If you make the 2020 team you must attend three out of the four training sessions, one of which is the December session, and, in addition, you **must** attend the GT May show, on the Sunday.

The first 3 sessions will be used to determine who is in the team and what individual events they run in. If you are unable to attend the compulsory and/or required amount of days, only extreme personal reasons or evidence of a prior commitment booked before these dates were released will be considered in allowing Handler or Dog to maintain their place on the team. This is purely at the discretion of Team Management.

- The "Super Win On Spot" is attainable at the CSJ Agility Open. This offers a place in all 3 individual events
- The Pentathlon spot will be taken from the results of the Pentathlon runs at the Agility 4 England Try Out in September.
- The Games spots will be taken from the results of the Games runs at the Agility 4 England Try Out

Once these Win on spots have been established the Welsh Team managers may pick more dogs and handlers from those that attend the Team Wales Performance Day held on 15th September at Cwm Farm, Caerphilly, CF83 1NH. (An indoor venue will be provisionally booked as an alternative in case of extreme weather conditions). Full details of this day will be announced on the WAO Team Wales FB page.

Win on places

All dogs who succeed with a win-on placement must obtain an official WAO measurement to be eligible to compete. This can be obtained at the Agility 4 England show or the CSJ Open. If the place is declined or the winner is ineligible, the next dog/handler pairing will be invited. In the unlikely event that neither of the top two dogs are eligible, the selection committee will revert to a selection process to fill that spot on the team. All win on spots must attend the Team Wales Performance Day unless permission is given by the Team management.

The "Super Win On Spot" – A place in all 3 individual events – via the CSJ Agility Open

Achieve the "Super Win On Spot" and you will be offered a place in **ALL 3 individual events - Biathlon, Pentathlon and Games.**

Earn points by placing in the top 8 in the overall Biathlon, Pentathlon, Games and CSJ National Championship as outlined below.

Individual classes in each event do not score points. Points are calculated separately for each height. The dog with the highest points in each height will gain the "Win On Spot" place for their country as long as the dog has placed in the top 8 of at least 3 events. If the highest placed dog has not achieved a top 8 in 3 events, then the Welsh management will decide if to award the WIN ON SPOT OR NOT

The highest placed Welsh dog in the Pentathlon in each jump height will be invited to represent Wales at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Pentathlon**.

Games Win on Spot – via Agility 4 England Show.

On September 6th - 8th @ Lydiard House, Lydiard Park, Lydiard Tregoze, Swindon, Wilts, SN5 3NY.

The highest placed Welsh dog in the Games in each jump height will be invited to represent Wales at the WAO Championships in the **Individual Games** event.

To simulate the WAO event, the following runs will be used to decide the outcome of the Pentathlon win on spot; **Friday** Jumping & Agility, **Saturday** Jumping, **Sunday** Agility and WAO Speedstakes.

The classes will follow WAO rules and will be scored using WAO individual Pentathlon scoring. WAO jump heights will be used.

The Speedstakes class will run in reverse order of the current standings after 4 rounds.

All dog and handler partnerships will also run in Snooker (Friday) and Gamblers (Saturday). The combined result will be used for a win on spot into the Games class and the performance of all competitors will be assessed to show their understanding of the Games classes to assist the Team managers when deciding other places on the Team.

Depending on size of entry, it is hoped that all of these classes will run in one ring, allowing the managers to assess performance in the consideration of other places.

The Entry fee for the Try Out is £35. Team Wales will receive £19 per entry profit.

Please read ALL the information below carefully:

Eligibility to enter the Try Out:

- Dog: KC Grades 6 & 7 or UKA Champion status on 1st September 2019. (Handlers may enter the event with the intention of reaching the required level/grade by 1st September. If they do not achieve this they will be unable to run and will forfeit their entry fee).
- You DO NOT need to be a UKA Member. Those handlers and dogs who are not registered with UKA can still enter. As part of entry they will need to register themselves and their dog with UKA and pay for this. They then need to notify UKA within five working days of the event that they wish to cancel their membership. A refund will then be given. They may only enter the Try Out event at the show
- Dogs must be eligible to travel outside of the UK under the rules of the Pet Travel Scheme. Further information can be found on the DEFRA web site (<http://www.defra.gov.uk/wildlife-pets/pets/travel/pets/>)
- All squad members must prove their own and dogs' eligibility to travel by March to the Team management

It is each handler's responsibility to ensure their dog's Pet Passport is valid to allow entry back into the UK on 18th May 2020

- Handler: To be born in Wales or a permanent resident of Wales, at the time of the event they are trying out at.

- A valid passport/documentation will be required and shown at the Team fund raising date
- It is preferred that the handler/dog combination competing at the selection day is the regular partnership during the preceding agility season so other results can be assessed when considering classes.

Competing Team & Reserve selection

In brief, the team will be decided using the following methods.

- Win on place via CSJ Agility Open (WAO Biathlon, Pentathlon & Games Class entry)
- Win on place via the Pentathlon competition at Agility 4 England Show (WAO Pentathlon Class entry)
- Win on place via the Games competition at Agility 4 England Show (WAO Games Class entry)
- WAO Wales 2019 medallists will be invited back to the team for a minimum of their automatic spot.

Remaining class spots will be offered to the partnerships who have achieved the win on places, providing the team management believe they will be competitive in these events. The Team Management may look to select additional dogs to fill these spots from those dogs that attend the Team Wales Performance Day.

Only dog and handler ENTERING & ATTENDING the try out held at the Agility 4 England show and the Team Wales Performance Day will be considered for Team Selection. In the event of a Handler or Dog not being able to attend, only veterinary or extreme personal reasons will be considered in allowing Handler or Dog to still be in contention for selection. This is purely at the discretion of Team Management. The team and reserves will be announced no later than 1st October 2019

WAO 2019 Medallists

WAO are inviting all individual podium winners to compete in the 2020 championships in the class in which their medal was won. Wales will be inviting all Welsh 2019 individual medal podium winners to a place on the team. These handlers will compete under the Welsh flag in the individual class in which the medal was won. To be considered for any other events they must follow the rules above.

Jump Height/Dog Height

There are four qualifying height divisions. Dogs may compete in a division larger than the actual dogs' height, but cannot compete in a lower division. Example: A dog which measures 450mm may enter & compete in the 600 division but cannot compete in the 400 division.

An official measurement will be taken on the day for all dogs applying for the 500 classes and lower, unless an official WAO measurement has already been taken for that dog. You must compete in all relevant WAO win on spot events, in the correct WAO height category

When entering the try out choose Toy for 300, Midi for 400, Std for 500, Maxi for 600.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

This show will run under the 2019 UK Agility Rules and Regulations

UK Agility Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the 2019 UK Agility rules.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility in order to compete. UK Agility's official rules & regulations are available free to download on registration of Handler/Owner to UK Agility. A rule book can be purchased on request direct to UK Agility, or at one of our shows. If you or your dog is not already registered, fill out the UK Agility registration form included in this schedule and add the registration fee to your entry fee.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of UK Agility rules and regulations including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

All competitors should familiarise themselves with the rules prior to the event.

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UK Agility Licensed shows, with the exception of dogs over 16 calendar months of age eligible to compete in Nursery Classes & Steeplechase.

Entries without fees paid in full will be returned. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees. If you use a recorded delivery service, you **must** specify No Signature Required.

Entries will not be accepted, changed or altered after the closing date or capping level has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition if it is: -
A bitch which is in season,
Suffering from any infectious or contagious diseases,
Interfering with the safety of any person or other animal.
Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn and neither in the event a dog and/or handler is dismissed from the competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal providing this was within accordance of UK Agility rules and regulations.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.

It is expressly understood that Competitors alone are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour, may, at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. No refunds of fees will be made in such a case.

No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.

No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the SHOW MANAGEMENT may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken the show management will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.

All competitors **MUST** clear up after their dogs at all times. Failure to do so will result in competitors being asked to leave the Show.

Dogs left in hot cars, or dogs appearing to be in distress, will be dealt with as seen fit by the Show Management.

Returned cheques do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a £20.00 service charge for returned cheques. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made before a competitor may compete. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls to a UK Agility account must be paid prior to the start of the event. If you enter online your entry will be deleted if payment is not made by the closing date.

Dogs should be measured while the dog is placed in a standing position on a flat surface such as a table. The measurement is taken from the perpendicular line from the top of the dog's withers to the flat surface.

All dogs, except the Maxi division, must have an official measurement before they run. If your official dog's measurement moves you into a different height than the one entered, you must notify the show secretary and your dog will be moved automatically.

If you are entering the casual class and wish to jump lower than your eligible height please tick the CRO box (Clear round only). Clear round rosettes will still be available for your run.
